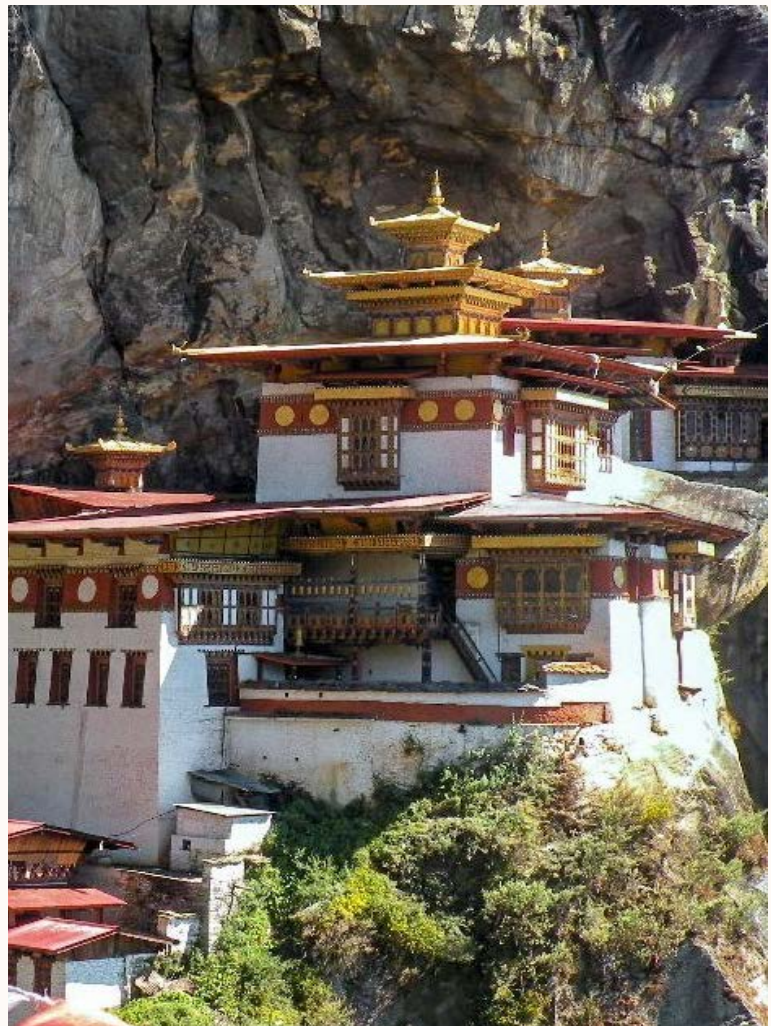

Climate Change & Gender

The 31st Kitakyushu Conference on Asian Women (KCAW 2020) will consider how well to promote gender equality and gender-responsive capacity building in mitigating climate change as called for by the Paris Agreement, which has just become effective this year. Goals 5 and 13 of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as well as the Paris Agreement will be discussed.

KCAW 2020 invites Kunzang Lhamu, Director of the National Commission for Women and Children at the Royal Government of Bhutan, as the keynote speaker to discuss and share Bhutan's gender-responsive climate initiatives. In addition, two community-based organizations from Japan will present their efforts and achievements to mitigate climate change or to provide gender-responsive shelters during the recovery phase of natural disasters.

(Director, National Commission for Women and Children, Bhutan)

Started career in 1994 at the Gross National Happiness Commission, Royal Government of Bhutan. Expertise includes gender analysis and mainstreaming as well as promoting and protecting the rights of women and children.

KIZUNA Asakura Disaster support Center for Mothers & Children

Established after the 2017 Northern Kyushu Flood in order to provide a safe post-disaster shelter for affected mothers and children. Learning from the Flood that made salient the special needs of mothers, children and women in general, KIZUNA offer dedicated support for women and children by providing counseling on child-raising, mental and physical support, and consultation to help victims put their lives back during the recovery phase of natural disasters.
